Miss Cowain was a school teacher and taught at Cannifton for thirty years, five as teacher of the junior room and twenty-five as principal. She was held in high esteem there and quite a number from Cannifton attended the funeral. After leaving Cannifton she was principal of Flinton public school for a few years, going to Massey about four years ago. She passed away in St. Joseph's Hospital, Blind River, on Monday, March 24, after a brief illness.

Miss Cowain retained ownership of the old homestead, which was on the Peterborough-Hastings County Line.

A former student now living in Regina has forwarded \$20 to start a fund to purchase a memorial for his former school teacher. CHANCY COX

An explosion which took place on the construction site of the prison at Warkworth on Tuesday February 22nd, took the life of 1 man and badly injured the second.

Chancey Cox, 43 of R. R. 3, Havelock, father of 5 children was instantly killed when the explosion hurled him 50 feet through the air.

Rushed to Civic Hospital in Peterborough was Bruce Johnston, 35, also of Havelock who suffered neck injuries. Mr. Johnston, 35, also of Havelock was unable to explain what had happened, but it is thought that the men were switching propane tanks when the blast occurred. Both men were working inside a concrete structure on top of a reservoir when the explosion took place.

John Edward Cross, a resident of Marmora township for the past 73 years, passed away in Belleville General Hospital on Sunday, Oct. 16th. He was in his 80th year.

Mr. Cross was born in Toronto, a son of the late John Cross, a native of Lancashire, Eng. and Jane Taylor, a native of London, Eng. In 1882 the family moved to Marmora Township where the deceased had lived ever since. At the age of 20 Mr. Cross went to work for the Canadian Goldfields, first as a laborer and later as a teamster when the Deloro Smelting & Refining Co. Ltd. took the property over in 1905. He was an employee of Deloro Smelting & Refining Co. Ltd. for 41 years and was the oldest pensioner of the Company.

In 1901 he was married to Ada Emigh and twelve children were born of the union. Ten of them survive as follows: James and William Cross, Deloro; Lena, Belleville; Mrs. Russell Roach (Alice), Belleville; Mrs. Harry Park (Mary), Springbrook; Mrs. Murray Empey (Eva), Marmora Township; Mrs. Harold Lowery (Gladys) Deloro; Mrs. Harry Gawley (Peggy) Belleville; Mrs. Clayton Smith (Stella) Marmora and Mrs. Closan (Betty), Cannifton.
