KARL YASCHUK

Death came very unexpectedly to Karl Yaschuk about 9 o'clock last Friday evening as a result of a heart condition. A couple of weeks ago he complained of feeling unwell and consulted Dr. H. Crawford, physician for Deloro Smelting & Refining Co. Ltd. After examination the doctor ordered a few weeks rest and the deceased's condition apparently was not serious until shortly before his death. He passed away about an hour after his condition became worse. The deceased was born in Kiev, Russia, about fifty-four years ago.

He came to Canada about the time of the first World War and some years later became a naturalized Canadian citizen. For most of the time he was employed by Deloro Smelting and Refining Co. Ltd. and was a faithful workman. He was of a quiet and friendly disposition. He leaves to mourn his passing a widow and five children; Annie, and Mrs. Henry Kartz and Mrs. Joseph Katulak, of Toronto, and Anastasia and Billie at home.

The funeral was held on Monday afternoon, service being conducted in St. Paul's Church by Rural Dean A. B. Caldwell. Interment took place in Marmora Protestant cemetery.

WALTER YASCHUK

A short time before noon on Friday, June 3rd, a very tragic accident happened at Deloro when little Walter Yaschuk was drowned in the Moira River. The little chap, who was about 5 years old, was playing with little Arthur Hart, near the river when he slipped in some way and fell into the water at the same time striking his head on a rock which rendered him unconscious. In this condition he was carried over the falls. The Hart lad, horrified at what he had witnessed ran to a man nearby and gave the alarm. Rescuers were speedily on hand and the maimed body of the little fellow was taken from the water. Artificial respiration was resorted to but without success.

Walter was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Kirylo Yaschuk, who with his family moved to Deloro about a month ago from Sault Ste. Marie. Besides his parents, deceased leaves three sisters, two brothers having predeceased him.

The funeral was held in St. Paul's Church, Marmora, , on Saturday afternoon, Rev. A. B. Caldwell conducted the services. Deloro Boy Scouts acted as pall-bearers, and the funeral was attended by many of the most prominent citizens testifying to the sympathy felt for the bereaved family. After about a week's illness of pneumonia Herbert Yatton passed away in Belleville General Hospital on Wednesday evening-, March 18th. He was fifty-eight years of age and was born in Glasgow, Scotland, coming to Canada as a lad. For some time he worked on the farms of George McComb. and John Eastwood in Rawdon township and later worked for George Wellman at the old Bellview Hotel, long before the name was changed to Bonarlaw.

For several years Mr. Yatton was an employee of Deloro Smelting- & Refining Co. Limited and for the past two years he had been employed at the Trenton Airport, where he liked the work and gave good satisfaction. Quiet and friendly, he was respected by all who knew him. During the first World War he enlisted with the 155th battalion Canadian Infantry and was later transferred to the Canadian Railway troops, with whom he served in Scotland. On his discharge he again took up his residence in Marmora. In recent years he had resided in Trenton. In December 1913 deceased was married to Mrs. Annie Smith, who survives him. A step-son, William Smith, and a step-daughter, Mrs. George Kerr, both of Marmora, also survive. The funeral was held on Friday afternoon, proceeding from the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Geo. Kerr to St. Paul's ' Church, where service was conducted by Rural Dean A: B. Caldwell. Interment took place in Marmora cemetery. The pall bearers were Messrs. Wm. HAN'S BODY RECOVERED FROM WATER AT MARMORA DAM

The body of a 64 year old Marmora man was recovered from the Crowe River in front of the Marmora Dam on Saturday morning by O.P.P. divers. Mr. Zommers and two friends were fishing from the top of the main dam on Friday evening. Suddenly he stumbled and fell into the water on his back. Attempts by his friends to get him to grab a fishing pole were in vain and he sank from sight in approximately 12 feet of water.

Many residents heard his friends shouting for help and several headed to the dam but in the darkness he could not be seen and it was decided to look for him Saturday morning. He was found around 7 a.m. shortly after the divers entered the water.

Although we do not have the official report as yet, it is thought that Mr. Zommers had suffered a heart attack or stroke and was the reason he did not cry out or make any move to help himself. Mr. Zommers and his wife have lived in the former residence of Mr. and Mrs. Jack Fluke on Thomas Street.

Funeral arrangements were handled by the Cassidy Funeral Home and the service took place on Tuesday, July 13th. at 3 p.m.
