



## Mr. Julius Bedore Celebrates 100th Birthday

The "Open House" held at Hastings Manor, Belleville, for Mr. Bedore by his daughters was all they hoped for, thanks to the many friends and relatives who came from as far away as Bermuda, Montreal, Detroit, Toronto; Kingston, Ottawa and the local area to extend greetings and congratulations.

All week dozens — more than a hundred of congratulatory messages for Mr. Bedore arrived at the Manor, the farthest coming from Innsbruck, Austria.

Topping the list of Telegrams and messages are those from Her Gracious Majesty Queen Elizabeth, Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau, Opposition Leader, Robert Stanfield, Premier John Roberts. The Honourable George Hees, local members of Parliament Lee Grills, Dr. T. A. Pot-

ter and Mayor J. R. Scott.

The tea table was centred by a large birthday cake, flanked by triple silver candelabra. Lovely floral arrangements were scattered about the reception room. Tea was poured and served by granddaughters and great granddaughters. Others looked after the signing of the guest book. When Mr. Bedore cut his cake, "Happy Birthday" was sung by all.

Two fifth generation babies were present, Tina Lynn Goodchild and Lisa Bedore, daughters of Mr. and Mrs. Brian Goodchild and Mr. and Mrs. James C. Bedore.

Mr. Bedore has seven daughters, twenty-two grand children, seventy-three great grandchildren and six great, great grandchildren.

# Centenarian Laid to Rest

MARMORA — Julius Bedore was laid to rest here Saturday — returned to the Hastings countryside from which he emerged to become one of the longest-lived Canadians of the century.

A simple burial service marked the tranquil end of the 104 years lived by Mr. Bedore — a life span that reached back to the days when this now-prospering community was still in the uncertain throes of settlement.

Until it closed last Wed-

nesday in a Belleville hospital room, his lifetime was a living contact with that era and the evolution of modern times.

It was inevitable that time — and its passing — would be one of the themes expressed at his memorial during the Anglican service in St. Paul's church here. The edifice whose stones today appear venerably timeworn, wasn't built until 1874 — six years after Mr. Bedore was born in the year after Confederation.

"To have 104 years of life is a gift . . . something that is exceptional," Rev. John Lombard, rector of St. Paul's told the 60 family members and friends gathered in the church.

"I don't know how you explain it," admitted the rector. "I found it impossible to comprehend that Mr. Bedore was born as he was — the year after Confederation."

A person of such great years, said Rev. Lombard, is "someone very, very special to all of us. It is a privilege to know one . . . It is so unusual, so remarkable. . ."

The brief service ended with the gracefully-timeless Abide With Me, after which the casket was placed in the vault at the nearby Marmora Protestant cemetery. It will be in this small knoll of ground — which now is flanked by the modern bustle of the Toronto-Ottawa Highway 7 traffic route — that Mr. Bedore will be buried in spring.

From the line of descendants he left — estimated to include close to 100 great- and great-great-grandchildren — eight grandsons escorted the centenarian to his final resting place as pall bearers.

## OBITUARY

### MRS. LILLIAN BEDORE

After some years of gradually failing health Mrs. Lillian Bedore passed away about 10 o'clock Sunday evening in the Nursing Home in Havelock. She had been confined to her home for the past few years, but when her condition became critical last week she was moved to the Nursing Home where she passed away.

She was born in Marmor Township on the 21st day of February, 1873, her parents being the late Robert and Margaret Jones (nee Jandrew.) Her grandfather, on the paternal side, was Hugh Jones, reeve of Marmor Township for a number of years in the 1860's. All her life was spent in this district and her friendliness and ready sympathy for others in time of sickness or trouble won her many friends, first in the Jones Settlement and then in Marmor village.

A descendant of the early pioneer she had seen many changes during her long life. With her memories of what she had herself seen and what had been told her by her parents and relatives Mrs. Bedore could tell in the most interesting manner of conditions in the early history of the district and the changes which had gradually taken place. She could also describe many interesting and amusing incidents. She was a devoted member of the Anglican Church and when health permitted a faithful attendant. For years she was a valuable member of the Ladies' Guild and helped in other Church activities.

The deceased is survived by her husband Julius Bedore. Their many years of happy married life was blessed with a large family and several daughters survive. They are Mrs. C. Boyd (Maggie), Belleville; Mr. Charles T. White (Clara) and Mr. Robert J. Gordon (Mamie), both of Detroit; Mrs. Fred Feeney (Eileen) New Westminster, B. C.; Mrs. R. Brophy (Muriel), Verdun, Que.; Mr. J. H. Berg (Mildred), Bermuda, and Mrs. Clifford Watson (Merle), Whitby. Four other children predeceased her — Robert Eugene, Hannah Helena, Frances Janet and Wilbert. The latter passed away this year and was a veteran of the first World War.

She is also survived by three brothers and one sister as follows: Cyril Jones, London, Ont.; Mrs. W. A. Kaitling, Kingston, Ont.; Charles Jones Havelock and Hugh Jones, Belleville. There are twenty-three grandchildren and twenty great grandchildren.

The funeral was held on Wednesday afternoon, proceeding from her late residence to St. Paul's Anglican Church where service was conducted by Rev. T. Harvey Good, rector of Madoc Parish. Interment was made in Marmor Protestant cemetery.



# as local illustrator donates book

With roots in Marmora, it seems appropriate for illustrator Elizabeth Bedore to donate the finished product of her first major project to the local library.

A story book, with cassette, "In The Land of Staff - Where It all Began" teaches children the basics of reading and understanding music. This volume, the first of three, was launched in mid-September - just in time for Christmas.

Beth was commissioned to do the project by the book's author, Paula Lynn Walker of Cavan Township, after they "hit it off" during an initial meeting last April.

The 20 illustrations were painstakingly crafted by Beth at her Marmora home, which doubles as a studio. In black-and-white, meticu-

lously shaded pencil drawings, the story visually unfolds before the reader's eyes.

Musical notes were literally created from scratch by Beth, and every character in the book, including the Music Fairy and magical music castle, was her original visual concept.

The note characters were to be "cartoonish", but the author made sure Beth didn't tamper with the technical aspects of the notes; they had to be recognizable in sheet music form.

"I came up with a medieval-munchkin idea, after several preliminary drawings, that satisfied both Paula and myself," explained Beth, adding "one of the biggest challenges was combining real children with the note children in each drawing."

Included with the book

is a sheet of stickers, which gives the reader a clear idea of what the book would look like in color. At present Beth is unsure if Volume II (which she is about to begin illustrating) will be in colour or not.

Completing the project in Marmora is fitting for Beth, as both her grandfathers and father are natives of the area. She's no stranger to it herself, with several childhood visits to her grandfather Ted Bedore's farm, north of Deloro, and the home of her grandparents, Jean and Charlie O'Connor, on Madoc Street.

Born in Vancouver, Beth grew up in Peterborough and left for Toronto in 1984 to pursue an education in fine art. She was one of 350 applicants from a pool of 1,400 to be accepted at the Ontario College of Art that

year.

Leaving school to get married, Beth now has two little girls and has just recently (with this project) begun the long road of establishing herself as an artist.

She admits that illustration isn't her first choice, but at OCA she was constantly getting mixed messages.

"My Fine Arts instructors told me my work was illustrative, but my design instructors all insisted my work was fine art," laughed Beth.

The book is available at Title's Book Store, in Peterborough, and music stores province-wide. Although she is a little shy, Beth is willing to sign books purchased by any of her Marmora neighbours. Watch for volume II sometime next Spring.

# Swimming In Crowe River

A tragedy occurred Sunday evening when Lois Faye Bedore, youngest daughter of Mrs. Wilbert Bedore and the late Mr. Bedore, passed away while swimming. She was an expert swimmer and enjoyed the pastime. She was in the water alone at the time, at the bathing beach just below the bridge over No. 14 Highway and no other swimmers were around at the time. It is reported one or two people saw her in the water, but knowing how well she could swim did not pay any particular attention.

No one knows when she went down but when she did not return home for supper her mother became alarmed and started out to look for her. When she could not be found a search was started. Dragging operations were started and continued throughout the night and all day Monday, except for a short time in the afternoon when the wind became too strong. Others searched the shores but no trace of the missing girl was found during the day.

A plane from Trenton, with a mechanical device by which it was possible to see into the water, also joined in the search for a while about noon.

The search was resumed early Monday evening and about 10.30 o'clock the body was found in about ten feet of water lying on a ledge of rock near a deep hole. Several boats were close to the spot at that time. Among those around when the body was found was Jack Hickey, Joseph Darrah Lorne Gawley, Fred Harvey, her brother Clayton and a number of others. The former two are said to have actually located the body.

The local and provincial police assisted during the day, but were not present when the body was found. They were immediately called and Coroner Dr. S. R. Beatty, of Madoc, was summoned.

For years Lois had been subject to occasional epileptic attacks. A medical examination showed that death was due to such an attack. There was no water in her lungs, which was evidence death was not due to drowning. The Coroner decided no inquest was necessary.

The deceased was 19 years and 3 weeks old. She had a good record as a student in the public school and Marmora high school. She also attended Madoc high school for a short time. She was a member of St. Andrew's United Church and for a few years was a member of the junior choir, occasionally taking a solo part.

Her mother, Mrs. Bedore, has the sympathy of the community in bereavement. About six months ago she lost both her husband and her father within a few hours of each other.

Besides her mother she is survived by one sister, Mrs. Cliff Goodchild (Doris), Marmora township, and three brothers, Clayton, Marmora; Eric, Hazelock; and Thomas, at home. She is also survived by three grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Julian Bedore and Mrs. Thos. E. Potts, all of Marmora.

The funeral was held yesterday afternoon from her late residence to St. Andrew's United Church, where service was conducted by Rev. K. J. Crawford. Interment was made in Marmora Protestant Cemetery.

She was a public school teacher in Marmora township for a number of years and teaching at that time was very different to what it is now. The school sections were very poor and received but little assistance from the Government, the teacher having to board around from house to house, and sometimes Miss Jandrew had to walk four miles to school and back again at night.

About thirty seven years ago she was united in marriage to Mr. Robert Jones, who with a family of seven children survive her. The names of the children are as follows Mrs. Julius Bedore, Marmora; Robert of Toronto; Cyrus, of Peterboro and Charles, Hugh, Mildred and Francis. She is also survived by two brothers; W. J. Jandrew, principal of the George street school, Ottawa, and Charles, of Frankford, both of whom were present at the funeral.
