Nice to hear from old Thessalon, Ontario. My mothers side of the family (Kings) all lived in the Soo area. In fact that is where my sister (Joan) and I claim as our birthplace.

Many thanks for the obituaries on George Logan & Mary Burns.

Margaret Edwards sent me information from the Ontario early census.

The information contained Delia's name and date of birth as 1892.

The Church Baptism record book states that Charles Redmond Logan was born 21 November, 1904 and baptized on 30 July, 1905. Do you have positive proof that your dad was born on 21 November, 1903 ?. The same book also states that John Hugh Logan and James Gordon Logan where born and baptized in our church and that the parents are George Logan and Mary Burns. Clarence Logan, Havelock told me that several of the children died young, perhaps we was refering to John Hugh and James Gordon. Since they are buried in this area I will investigate this matter.

Another James Logan born in 1892 and died in October, 1896 at the age of four was buried in our cemetery. They neglected to mark in the parents names in the Church Burial Book. Perhaps it is a twin to Delia Logan who was born in 1892 too.

You feel that Leo Edison Logan was the son of George Logan & Mary? Mary Burns would have been 46 years old at the time? The Church record book clearly has marked in under the title, parents as "UNKNOWN". Perhaps you could investigate this little mystery for me. I will send you an up-dated copy of the Logan family tree when more pieces come together.

As an active member of the Cemetery Board, I spend a considerable amount of my time examining and reviewing our Church records and cemetery files. On the 27 June, 1972 the Logan family purchased six burial lots. At present Clementine, Redmond and Josephine are buried in three of these lots. It has come to my attention that the family has NO intentions of utilizing the remaining three lots. If that is so, the Cemetery Board would appreciate verification from the family that they would consider releasing them. The Boards buy-back price would be one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per lot. The price breaks-down as follows; \$100.00 for the lot and \$150.00 for the Care & Maintenance or Perpetual Care Trust Fund. The \$150.00 is money that does directly into an Ministry approved Trust Fund. The Board can only use the interest from this Trust Fund to care and maintain the cemetery. For this reason the Board cannot return that part or portion to the interment rights holder.

In lieu of a cheque from the Board the family may wish to make a donation of said amount (\$300.00) to the Cemetery Board's White Cross Replacement Fund. Located directly above the Logan family plot is the present white wooden cross. Over the years the wood has deterioated to the point where it soon will fall down from rot. Before this happens the Board is attempting to raise the necessary funding through private donations to have the cross replaced. Discuss the matter with other family members and notify the Board by letter of their intentions.



Dear Gerald;

I am writing to thank you for the excellent information you have sent me. I really appreciate your efforts!

Finding out Jessie Burns' maiden name (Carpenter) allowed me to return to the Ontario Census, looking for more information.

The Ontario Census of 1861, 1871, 1881, and 1891 for Hastings County, can be found in the Feterborough Public Library, on microfilm. They have micorfilm reader machines there, two of which have copying abilities. I have enclosed two sample copies of an 1871 Census for a Downard family in Marmora and the Lake, as it is referred to in the Census. The second paper has information on the livestock, etc. which that particular family information on the livestock, etc. which that particular family owned at that time. (This type of information was recorded for all those surveyed at the time.)

I believe that the Ontario Census for Hastings can also be found at the Peterborough Centennial Museum, and perhaps may also be ordered from the Archives of Ontario in Toronto.

I should also mention another microfilm I looked at from the Archdicese of Kingston. It may not have any new information for you. It contains the records from Sacred Heart Church in Marmora, dating back to about 1874. It was interesting to look at because it had been fully indexed by a genealogical society, and therefore provided easy access to finding a particular name. I was able to borrow the microfilm from the Archdicese for a fee of \$5.00.

You also asked me about the book <u>The Valley of the Trent.</u> In case you are still looking, it was edited by Edwin C. Guillet, and published by The Champlain Society for the Government of Ontario, University of Toronto Press, 1957. It is 474 pages long, very detailed, with some information on the Marmora area. There is a section which includes selected writings of people who visited the Trent Valley area in the 1800's, one of which was an excerpt from a certain James Logan, writing in 1836. I'm not sure whether he truly is an ancestor of mine, but when I start researching the Logan's in the Census Returns, maybe I will find that indeed he is.

Now I will get on to some corrections.

On page 9 of your Locan family tree report, change Marie L. Logan

to Letitia Mary Logan (Marie) born Sept. 1, 1902.

On page 4, add Michael John Logan, born 4 July, 1923, to Irene Logan's children. (This information is oral history, and therefore subject to reasonable doubt.)

On page 9, you have a James Gordon Logan listed. There was a James Logan born in the 1890's, buried at age 4 in 1896 in Sacred Heart Cemetery, which you list with the Mystery Logans. He was the son of Mary Josephine and George. As for the other Logan, he did not belong to the same family.

As well, Delia Logan was born in 1892, I believe. She was another member of the family.

Now, on to the new information I've found.

Realizing that Jessie Burns was born Jessie Carpenter, I looked for Carpenters in the Census. I knew they were present at the Baptism of William Burns, so I thought they might have been in Marmora for awhile.

In the 1861 Census, I found a Joseph Carpenter, who was listed as 40 years old at the time, but no family with him. He was also listed as "coloured". This got me wondering about Marmora's racial history (as well as my own!).

I also found another Carpenter family in 1871-1881-1891.

In 1871
Carpenter, Philip Age 47 (they incorrectly put 37, but after observing later years, I realized the error)
Odel S Age 48 His wife Both born in Quebec.

Caroline Age 11 daughter Born in Ontario.

Odelia Age 7 daughter Born in Ontario.

Orella Age 19 daughter Born in Quebec.

They are listed as Catholic and French. Philip is listed as a mason.

In the 1891 Census Return, the Carpenters are listed as Filin (inaccurate spelling\possible language barrier)Age 68 and Odelia Age 72. Philip or Phillipe, is still listed as a stone mason.

It appears that there were inaccuracies in the Census, with ages and names bearing many discrepancies throughout the years.

In terms of racial origin, the census only included such a definition in the 1861 Census Return; after that they discontinued that section of the survey. In a way I wish they hadn't because although losesh Constitute was been although losesh Constituted and the losesh losesh

Brunswick, I couldn't help but wonder about a possible connection between these Carpenters.

If you find anything about the Carpenters I would be grateful.

Finally, enclosed you have found my grandmother Marie Dainard (Logan)'s school picture. I would guess that it dates back to about 1914-1915 (my grandmother was born in 1902, and she looks to be about twelve years old there). It was taken in front of the school in Shanick, which was still standing three years ago, when my husband and I went for a drive that way.

The following are the names of the people that my grandmother identified for me. (She's 90 years old now, so again, the oral history may not be perfectly accurate.)
