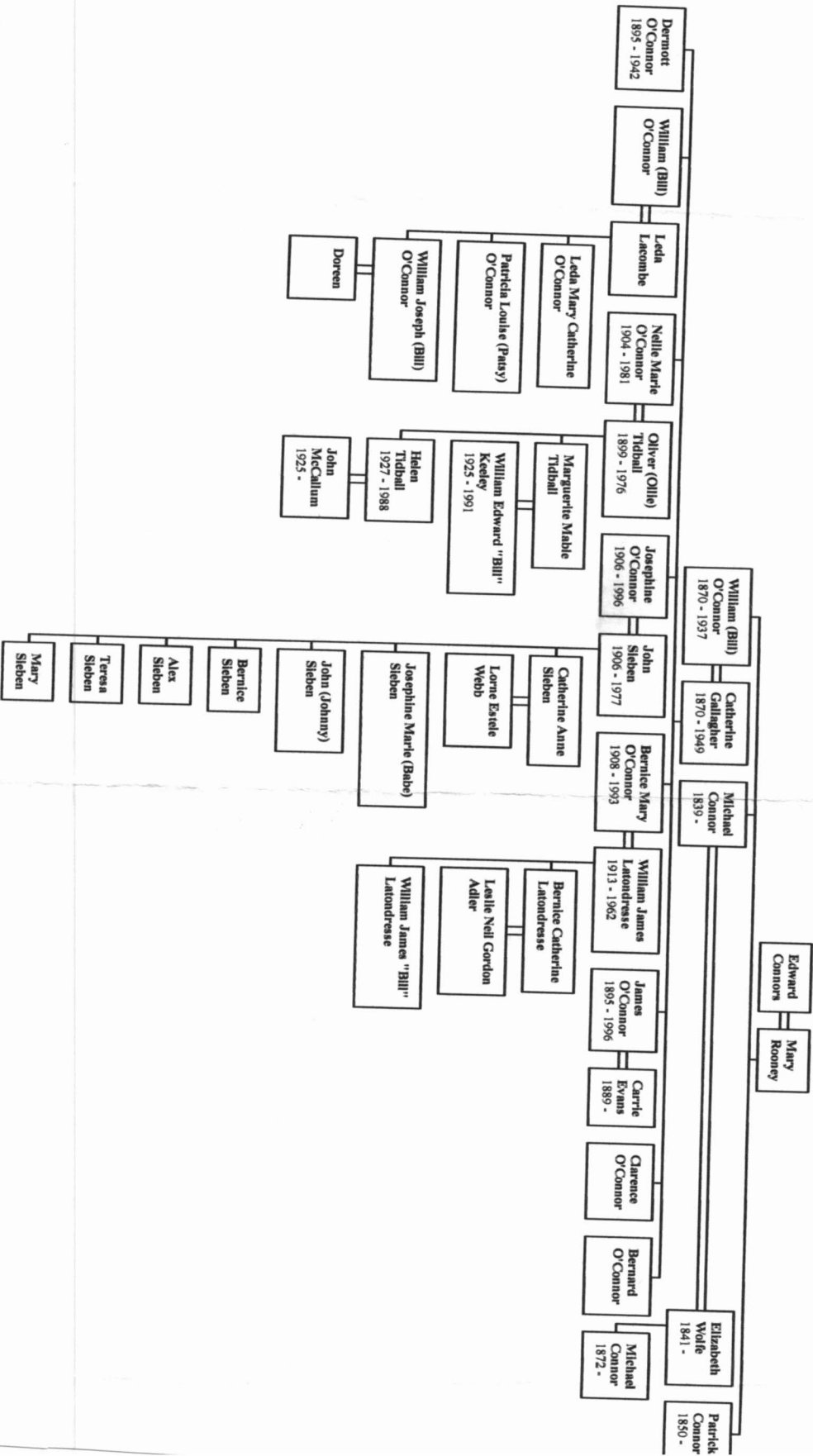

MR. JAMES WHYTOCK

After a brave fight against the "grim reaper," for several weeks, death yesterday morning claimed one of Madoc's sturdiest and oldest citizens in the person of James Whytock, sr., in the 77th year of his age. He had been in declining health for the past year or two and a complication of severe stomach troubles during the past few weeks hastened the end. Only his wonderful vitality and bodily strength kept him alive for many days past, but it had his boast that he had never been ill a day in his life.

Mr. Whytock was a rugged representative of that forceful race that has helped to maintain British supremacy and dominates trade and commerce throughout the world. He was born at Barnhill, Perthshire, in Scotland, June 20th, 1883, son of John and Margaret Whytock, and came to Canada at an early age, settling eventually in Madoc in the early sixties. He married Miss Miller, who survives him. From small beginnings, his business grew to one of the most extensive in the County of Hastings. He had a wonderful mind for business details, and could "work out" problems in his head easier than many could with pencil and paper.

He served this village in a public capacity faithfully and well for many years—first as councillor and afterwards as reeve and member of county council. He was never averse to a "fight" in municipal politics, and many opponents succumbed to his popularity at the polls.

Surviving him are his widow and grown up family of eleven children—James, jr., Charles and Walter of Madoc, David of New Hampshire; Mrs. Miller of Toronto, Mrs. Shrigley of Peterboro, Mrs. Fox of Prince Edward county, Mrs. Harry Connors of Marmora, Mrs. Alex MacGregor, Mrs. W. J. Hill, and Miss Martha, of Madoc,—North Hastings Review.

KILLED ON THE TRACK.

PATRICK CONNOR RUN OVER BY A LOCOMOTIVE ON THE MIDLAND.

(Peterboro' Review.)

A fatal accident, of a very sad character, occurred on the Midland Railway on Friday afternoon, by which Mr. Patrick Connor lost his life. He was firing on locomotive No. 34, which was bringing a freight train down the line. At Lorneville Junction the train stopped and Connor went under the engine to clean out the ash pan. Before he had accomplished this the signal to start was given, and the engineer, Albert Hamlin, not being aware that he was under the engine, opened the trottle. The train commenced to move and Connor was crushed under the ash pan. When taken out it was found that his left arm was broken near the shoulder, his left leg broken at the ankle and he was injured on the breast, the latter being the most severe. There were in addition other bruises about his body. Death was instantaneous. Mrs. Connor, the mother of the unfortunate victim of this sad accident, resides in Peterboro', on Wolfe street. The remains of her son were brought to Peterborough on the 10 o'clock train last night. He was the poor widow's only son and only child, and she has no other relatives here. A sudden death is at any time and under any circumstances a sad occurrence, and in this case the circumstances render it more than usually sad. Patrick Connor was the sole support of a widowed mother, the nature of whose grief on hearing of the sudden and terrible death of her only son may be imagined. She is an elderly lady of over sixty years of age. He has been employed on the Midland Railway since the month of April last year. All who were acquainted with him have the same word to say of him. He was a steady sober, hardworking man, a good citizen and a faithful son. He is said by intimate acquaintances to have been an exemplary young man in every way, and one against whom not a word could be said. The driver of the locomotive which ran over him, Hamlin, is said to have been greatly affected by the accident.

MISS MAY CONNORS LAID TO REST

The sad death of Miss May Connors, one of Marmora's most popular young ladies, occurred in Toronto on the 5th inst., a short reference to which was made in our last issue. Miss Connors with a party of friends visited the Exhibition and secured lodgings with Mrs. Loveridge 24 Soho Street. On returning from the Exhibition grounds on Tuesday night she retired having been instructed how to turn off the gas. Before leaving her friends she asked some one to call her early in the morning as she was a very sound sleeper and liable to sleep late. At about seven o'clock next morning as requested one of her friends rapped on her door several times and getting no reply entered her room and found her unconscious. Immediately making an alarm, two doctors were summoned who found her suffering from gas poisoning, having accidentally turned on the gas after extinguishing it. For three hours the two doctors did all in their power to revive her but all their efforts failed and at ten o'clock they pronounced her dead. In the mean time a priest administered the last rights of the Catholic Church. A coroner being summoned, on examining the room and questioning the guests deemed an inquest unnecessary as it was clearly a case of accidental gas poisoning. The body was then removed to undertaking rooms, embalmed and prepared for burial after which it was conveyed to the Union Station and placed on board the 10.30 express for Marmora. Several friends who were attending the Exhibition accompanied the remains home. The funeral took place Friday morning. Rev. Father O'Rielly celebrating the High Requiem Mass. Mr. and Mrs. Connors have the deepest sympathy of their host of friends in the district in their sad bereavement.
