

OBITUARY

JOHN J. TERRION

At 5.45 on Sunday morning March 13 John Joseph Terrion, one of the most popular and most active citizens of Marmora, passed peacefully to his reward at the age of 64 years.

The deceased had been suffering for the past ten years with progressive paralysis, but only a few days prior to his death did he fall sick, with small pox which was destined, not only to end fatally, but to be the most doleful event in the annals of Marmora's history.

Owing to the contageous disease his many friends were barred from paying the respect, which they owed to him, who worked so faithfully for them during his life.

The deceased leaves a widow and seven children:—Mrs. Chas. Thompson of Eldorado, John F., James V., Dan J., Agnes E., Patrick E., at home and Wilfrid L., en route for the Holy Priesthood. Besides his family he leaves five visters Ellen and Kate of Marmora, Isobel of Kemptville, Mrs. M. Legrow of Peterboro, Mrs. A. Beddome of Winnipeg; and two brothers James of Marmora and Patrick of Michael B. C.

In compliance with the rules of the Board of Health, a private funeral took place on Monday morning March 14th, and even his own family had to remain at the house and watch their loving father go on the path, where all glory leads.

High Requiem was sung at 9 o'clock by Rev. Father Hanley and interment took place in the Catholic cemetery, directed by the Catholic Order of Foresters, of which he was a fait ful member.—com.

On Sunday last, June 6, the Sacred Heart parish experienced a day, which the pious parishioners will not easily forget. FATAL ACCIDENT AT BARN RAISING

JAMES GALLAGHER KILLED

Samuel Rogers Arrested for Deed-Preliminary Trial and Inquest.

On Saturday afternoon there was quite a sensation in Marmora Village and Township when it was learned that James Gallagher had been killed by a companion while engaged in doing statute labor on the 8th concession of Marmora township.

Three men were engaged in drawing gravel and spreading it on the road when the tragedy occurred. They were the deceased, who was pathmaster, Samuel Rogers and Edward Storey. According to reports Gallagher and Rogers had quarrelled several times during the day and the affair reached a climax between three and four o'clock, when Rogers struck Gallagher on the head with a shovel, the blow resulting in his death.

Rogers and Storey, when they realized that the deceased was seriously injured, tried to revive him by carrying water in a hat from a near by stream. Their efforts proving vain they then placed the body in the box of Hugh Farrell's wagon, for whom Rogers was working, and the latter then started out to find his employer. In the meantime Edward Flynn had discovered what had occurred and informed Farrell. The latter, after hurrying to see if any assistance could be given the victim, immediately summoned Dr. Thomson. The doctor hurried out and a brief examination convinced him that life was extinct, and he at once notified Coroner Dr. Bissonnette, of Stirling. He also gave instructions that the body was to be left in the wagon until the Coroner arrived.

Dr. Bissonnette arrived on the scene about 8 o'clock, accompanied by Dr. Thomson. After an examination of the deceased a jury was sworn in and an inquest opened. But little evidence was taken and the inquest was adjourned until te-day (Thurs day). A permit for the burial of the deceased was issued, and Rogers and Storey were summoned to appear as witnesses at the adjourned inquest Just why the Coroner failed to have a warrant issued for the arrest of Rogers, or to hold a proper post mortem examination is a mystery, but in any case the mistake is an expensive one for the county.

On Sunday Mr. Daniel Gallagher, brother of the deceased, laid a complaint with Mr. B. C. Hubbell, J. P., who issued a warrant for the arrest of Rogers. County Constable Barrons served the warrant and the prisoner was brought to the village and placed in one of the cells in the hall. The hearing was first fixed for Monday but the prisoner was remand. ed until Tuesday morning.

Magistrates B. C. Hubbell and Wm. Bonter presided at the preliminary rial. Wm Carnew, County Crown Attorney, represented the Crown, W. D. 1. Shorey, of Belleville appeared for the Defendant, and A. A. McDonald. of Marmora was present on behalf of the Gallagher family.

Dr. Thomson was the first witnes'. He described the injuries to the de-There was an abrasion over he left temple about an inch above the eye brow, the nose was fractured and there was a mark below the bridge of the nose and also a cut between nostril and lip. Right eye was black and blue and left eye blood-shot. The neck also appeared to be fractured. On cross examination the doctor stated that death was probably due to the neck being fractured and the blows in themselves might not have resulted fatally The neck might have been broken when the victim fell instead of when the blow was struck. No post-mortem examination was held.

Mr. Hingh Farrell gave his evidence very cearly which was largely as above stated The prisoner had confessed to tiking the deceased with the shove!, but claimed it was in self defence.

Edward Storey was the only other witness called. He is not very bright intellectually and it was hard to get his evidence. Apparently he was afraid that if he told what had occurred be might get himself into trouble. told of Gallagher and Rogers quarielting during a considerable part of the He did not see the blow struck with the shovel, but turned just as the victim fell and Rogers then struck Gallagher a number of times while he was on the ground. The prisoner told him he had such a temper he couldn't help

As a result of the Preliminary trial the body, which had been buried on Monday, was exhumed on Wednesday and a post-mortem examination held by Drs. Thomson and Crawford.

The inquest was resumed this morning, the evidence being about the same as that given at the Preliminary trial. The verdict of the jury was to the effect that the deceased came to his death as the result of a blow struck by the prisoner with a shovel, and that the accused did not intend to cause death. It also recommended that the accused be tried for man-slaughter instead of

The late James Gallagher was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Gallagher. He was thirty-four years of age and unmarried. He resided alone on the old homestead. Besides his parents he is survived by five sisters and two brothers.

The pioneer log homes of this area which were built mostly during the late 1800s, are gradually falling into decay if they haven't already disappeared.

Last week Mr. P.V. Fitzpatrick, 25 Oak Street, Havelock, brought out two pictures of a log home that used to stand in what is now a field in Cordova near and behind the Free Methodist Church in that hamlet. There is now no indication of a building having ever stood where once Mr.

Fitzpatrick's grandh. Anne Gallaher used to tend her hollihocks outside the door and where she sat in the sun one summer day with her sister Mary (Murphy) and had her picture taken. This log house, according to Mr. Fitzpatrick was built in 1874.

Another old log building which has met a better fate and undergone a recent re-incarnation is one about five miles north of Havelock on a farm owned for many years by the Toms family
