Marmora Loses Pioneer In Robert Jones

(Examiner Correspondence.)

MARMORA, March 11.-The last survivor of a family of ten children born to pioneer Irish settlers of Marmora township passed away on Friday morning, close to the place of his birth, in the person of Robert

The late Mr. Jones was born on May 8, 1853, his parents being the late Hugh and Arme Jones. His father was reeve of Marmora township according to directories of Hastings county for the year 1860 and 1864, and doubtless occupied the office in the years intervening. He was also a justice of the peace.

His mother, before marriage was Anne Keys. Her father, Royal Keys. a native of the County Fermanagh, Ireland, passed away on July 28th, 1871, at the advanced age of 107

years.

The late Robert Jones was proud of his Irish descent and the longevity of many of his kinsfolk and was quite an authority on events which dated back to his earliest years.

On January 17, 1872, he was married to Margaret Jandreau of Rawdon township, who was then the teacher at Marmora S.S. No. 2. She was a teacher of the days when teachers went to all families in the school section in turn for bed and board. Seven children were born of this marriage, of which one, Robert, is deceased. The others are Charles, clerk of Marmora and Lake town-ship, Cyprus, Ottawa; Hugh, Belleville; Mrs. Julian Bedore, Marmora; Mrs. A. Kaiting, Kingston; and Mrs. H. Mitchell, Crediton.

Well Known Farmer

Mrs. Jones passed away about thirty years ago. For several years after, the late Robert Jones continued to reside at the old homestead, but later resided in turn with his granddaughter, Mrs. William Prest. Rawdon township, and his son Charles, Marmora township, at whose home his demise occurred, foilowing a stroke sustained about a month ago. In addition to his children, he is survived by 37 grandchildren and 26 great grandchild-

For the greater part of his life, he was one of the township's best known farmers, but for a period of about ten years as a young man he worked in lumber camps for the Rathbun Company taking goodly sized contract. He was assessor for Marmora and Lake townships for about fifteen years, and when in his forties laid out the first colonization money for his township, continuing to serve in that capacity for ten years. For many years he was school trustee in his own section. He was also a director of the Marmora Cheese Factory for many years. In religion he was an Anglican

and until more recent years, attended Holy Trinity church from the time of its erection onwards. He served as rector's warden for some years under the late Canon C. M. Harris. He was an ardent Conservative though not aspiring to any office in the local association. He was highly respected for his many fine qualities and his death will be mourned by a wide circle of friends.

The funeral cortege will leave the residence of his son Charles Jones, Marmora township, at 1.30 p.m. on Sunday, for service in St. Paul's church, which will be conducted by the rector, Rural Dean A. B. Caldwell. Interment will take place in Marmora Protestant cemetery.
