On March 25th, 1869, a by-law was enacted by the County that no taxes shall be levied in any of the minor municipalties within the County of Hastings for the purpose of paying for sheep killed. It was further enacted that no municipality shall be liable for any sheep killed in said municipality to any person or persons whatsoever, etc. To-day such regulations are under the control of the Province and are entirely different.
