Employment on Highway

The article in last week's Herald in regard to the employment of local men in connection with the construction work on No. 7 Highway has aroused a certain amount of discussion and it appears to be advisable to deal more fully with certain phases of the question.

Since work commenced on the three sections under contrac 454 Hastings County men have been employed or offered employment on the Highway, of which about a third were from Marmora Village or Marmora township. A few declined to start in at the work assigned to them or quit after a short time and a few others were discharged for various reasons. A number have also been laid off temporarily, owing to unavoidable circumstances, but the latter will be the first to be taken on again when it is possible to carry on operations on a larger scale and work on the new bridge is started.

One cause of misunderstanding apparently arose from the fact it has been necessary in the centre section to bring in quite a number of experienced hand drill men from the northern part of the County and from around Tweed. All the drilling on that part of the Highway is being done by hand and a number of the men from the district employed as drillers were found to be without experience and were let out or put at other work. When the men from Tweed and the north part of the County came in, a report was started that they were not local men as required by the contract. As pointed out last week Hastings County as a whole helps pay for the Highway and County men are classed as local men.

The value of the employment furnished by the work on the Highway to the County and to Marmora Village and tewnship can hardly be estimated. Without the work Marmora Village would have found it a very serious matter to provide relief for the unemployed and there would have been much hardship and suffering which has been avoided.

Leo Laton Killed

A fatal accident occurred on the Henniger & Scott section of No. 7 Highway yesterday afternoon. Leo Laton, aged 21, of Actinolite, was springing a hole ready for a blast in the rock cut on the Richardson property, about four miles east of Marmora, when in some way the blast was set off prematurely. The victim was leaning over the hole and the top of his head was blown completely off. Provincial Constables Percy Gray, of Marmora, and Ted Hill, of Madoc, investigated the circumstances and Coroner Dr. F. J. Nickle of Eldorado, was called. He decided an inquest was unnecessary.

The remains were brought to F. N. Marett & Co's undertaking room and later were removed to the deceased's home to await burial. He was unmarried.
