The following article which is taken from the Seattle Daily Times refers to a former resident who was born and grew up in or near Marmora. Mr. Maloney moved to North Bend in 1888 and has lived there ever since. His friends in this vicinity will be glad to learn that he has not only been successful from a business standpoint, but has also won the respect and esteem of his fellow citizens being elected to the highest office in the gift of the newly incorporated city, that of its first mayor.

North Bend, Wednesday, Feb. 24.— This city voted almost unanimously yesterday for the incorporation as a city of the fourth class. While a good Vote was cast, the election was very quiet and the entire vote was polled early in the day. There was but one ticket in the field and no scratching was done. The ticket elected consists of Peter J. Maloney, mayor; E. Catching. W. C. Weeks, Charles Thaldorf, Fred Damburat and A. R. Mason, councilmen; E. J. Seigrist, treasurer.

Several erroneous reports have been given prominence by other newspapers of Seattle to the effect that the town was badly divided on the subject of incorporation and whether the town should lie wet or dry, and each of these reports has been made without any foundation, and the real status of affairs has been reported correctly in The Times only. The people of this city are united almost to a man on these questions and are justly indignant over the

Your Irish Name: O'Driscoll clan's claim to Co. Cork

Eidersceoil, the founder of the OhEidersceoil (anglicized as O'Drisceoil), is a descendant of Lughaidh Laidhe, the first of the Corca Laoidhe clan. So the O'Driscolls have a long-standing claim to territory in County Cork (Corca).

The O'Driscolls were pressured out of South Kerry by the O'Sullivans and so they settled around Baltimore in south-west Cork. Further pressured by the O'Mahoneys and O'Donovans, the O'Driscoll territory was further reduced. But the clan held on in Cork and in 1460 the clanchief founded the Franciscan monastery there.





Notables

During the seventeenth century, many O'Driscoll men were prominent in the army of James II in Ireland. Cornelius O'Driscoll, a colonial in the Irish brigade, distingiushed himself at the battle of Ondara in 1707.

The O'Driscolls were imprisoned repeatedly by the British because of their unsewering loyalty to the Catholic Faith. Cromwell confiscated their land and executed the leaders of the clan. The survivors' descendents still live in the county today.
