Sister M. Josephine O'Neill Recipient of Canada 125 Medal

Sister M. Josephine was one of the 10 Brockville and area people to be awarded the special medal in celebration of Canada's 125th Anniversary in June at the Brockville Arts Centre.

Sister M. Josephine entered the Sisters of Providence in 1935, and, since 1977 she has been at St. Vincent de Paul Hospital in Brockville, where she works in Pastoral Care. Prior to 1977, she worked in Kingston, Arnprior and Smiths Falls.

Following a year of laboratory technology training at Ottawa General Hospital in 1941, Sister Josephine went to St. Francis General Hospital in Smiths Falls where she was in charge of the laboratory for 30 years.

The medal Sister Josephine received was struck in 1992 by the Government of Canada in celebration of Canada's 125th anniversary, to recognize individuals who have made an outstanding contribution to their fellow citizens, their community or to Canada. This was not the first time Sister Josephine had been so honoured. In 1984, she was awarded the Ontario Bicentennial Medal for Volunteer Work.

Two other Sisters of Providence, Sisters Irene Forrester and Joan LaFleur received the Canada 125 Medal at separate ceremonies.
