### James Ross Loveless

The funeral service for James Ross Loveless, 64, who died suddenly at his home, R.R. 3, Marmora, on Wednesday, April 19th, were held Friday afternoon, April 21st at Howden Funeral Home. Rev. Robert Stewart officiated.

Son of the late Mr. and Mrs. James Roy Loveless, he was born and educated at Wooler. He had spent all his working life in Marmora, having been employed by Deloro Smelting and Refining Co.
