MRS. GRACE MARIA REYNOLDS

It was with a feeling of sincere regret that the people of this community learned of the sudden passing of Mrs. Grace Maria Reynolds at the home of her daughter, Mrs. W. M. Gowling, Ottawa, on Friday. While her health had been poor in recent years, lately it was thought she was improving somewhat. She had been visiting her daughters in Ottawa for a couple of months and it appeared the rest and change was helping her, but on Friday Mrs. Reynolds passed peacefully away, without any signs of her serious condition, as a result of a heart attack.

The late Mrs. Reynolds was born in Cookstown sixty-one years ago last January, a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. William Armstrong. On December 19, 1899, she was married to William Robert Ruce Reynolds, a young electrical engineer, who was gaining an enviable reputation in the designing and construction of municipal Hydro-Electric distribution systems. In connection with Mr. Reynolds' professional duties they resided in Acton, Stayner, Mitchell, St. Marys, Orillia, Forest and Listowell, before coming to Deloro about sixteen years ago, where Mr. Reynolds was engaged as chief electrician. After a short residence in Marmora the family moved to Deloro, where they continued to reside until after the death of Mr. Reynolds, which occurred in Nicholls Hospital, Peterborough, on August 18th, 1938.

From the time they first came to Marmora Mr. and Mrs. Reynolds took an active interest in community and church affairs. The deceased was a valued member of St. Paul's Ladies' Guild, assisting particularly in the activities of the Deloro group. Mrs. Reynolds also taught a class in the Deloro Sunday School for some time while her husband was superintendent. Kindly and cheerful Mrs. Reynolds had the art of making many friends and holding their good-will and esteem.

She is survived by five sons and three daughters. They are Arthur Reynolds, Huntingdon, Long Island, N. Y.; Roger, New York; John, Charles and William at home; Mrs. W. M. Gowling and Jean, Ottawa, and Eleanor at home. She is also survived by four sisters Mrs. A. V. Wilson, Orlando, Florida; Mrs. J. Hills and Mrs. M. Harding, Vancouver, B.C., and Mrs. J. Fisher, Collingwood. The sympathy of the community goes out to the family in their bereavement.
